

# **Community foundations in figures**



307
Seal of Approval community foundations exist in Germany.

Of these, 13 have received the Seal of Approval for the first time in 2016.



29.000 community donors exist in Germany.

This figure increased by 16,000 last year.



# 334 million

euros is the capital of the Seal of Approval community foundations in Germany.

Since the end of 2014, it has grown by EUR 29 million.


A total of 74 Seal of Approval community foundations are millionaires — five of them have more than EUR 10 million.

A total of 43 Seal of Approval community foundations have capital of less than EUR 100,000.

### Receipts and expenditures \*

The Seal of Approval community foundations received **EUR 15.4 million in donations** in 2015.


This equals an average of about **EUR 50,000 in donations per community foundation**.

Half of the community foundations received less than EUR 20,000 in donations.

The community foundations spent **EUR 18 million in subsidies** aiding their causes.

# 1 million hours


is the approximate time volunteers worked for community foundations in 2015.

## **Seal of Approval community foundations work for the advancement of ...** (in per cent)






### **Development of the community foundations in Germany**



The first community foundations were created in Gütersloh and Hanover in 1996 and 1997 respectively. Ten years later the 100th community foundation was established in Wesel. During the next ten years the number of Seal

of Approval community foundations tripled: in 2016 the Lutherstadt Wittenberg Community Foundation was the 300th community foundation to receive the Seal of Approval.
